Swan City Council Meeting Minutes May 7, 2020

Present: Mayor Harding, Clerk Heywood, Councilmen Downing, Gobbel, Harding, Heywood

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.

A motion was made to approve the minutes: 1) Harding 2) Heywood All were in agreement.

Councilwoman Downing asked about the Gilpin's septic situation. The mayor explained how the process works. He said the situation has been turned over to the Marion County Dept. of Health.

Next, an update on gravel was discussed. Chad Clark, DBA JNC Building, says that he can get the city a load of gravel for \$400 and would charge an additional \$100 for labor. A motion to approve this amount was approved: 1) Gobbel 2) Downing All were in agreement.

Councilman Gobbel then explained that he had already had his own driveway taken care of. Normally, the city would have to pay for this, so he suggested, that if the city was willing, a partial reimbursement might be in order. Discussion ensued and Councilwoman Downing expressed that she did not feel the city should reimburse the councilman. He then was quick to suggest that the matter be dropped.

A hearing for the maximum tax levy and a hearing to have the budget re-done were had.

Clerk Heywood mentioned that she had approached Waste Management about rescheduling the city clean-up day. They are not ready to reschedule yet, but assured her that Swan will be at the top of the list when they are.

The mayor suggested that it may be necessary soon to replace the water meters in town.

Councilman Gobbel said that the water lines need to be flushed. The clerk will contact Bill Moore about setting up a date to do this.

A small discussion then ensued about the possibility of live-streaming future council meetings.

A motion was made to pay the bills: 1) Gobbel 2) Harding All were in agreement.

A motion was made to adjourn: 1) Gobbel 2) Heywood All were in agreement.
